Rules and Regulations

“EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH”

STALLS: Stalls are permanent 10 x 10, with doors. Doors MAY NOT be removed. Exhibitors will be responsible for damage to the stalls. Stall fee is \$125.00 (no first bedding included). Stall fees are not refundable after the closing date. Horses without a stall will be assessed a \$50.00 grounds fee, per day. Any damage to stalls must be reported to the shows management upon your arrival, failure to do so will constitute liability for any fees charged by the dream park.

ARRIVAL TIMES: Stalls will be available after 12 noon April 4th 2018 and must be vacated no later than 12:00 noon the day after the show April 8th 2018. Prior arrangements for early arrivals and late departures **must** be made in advance of the show and will be assessed a \$25.00 per day charge. Arrangements may be made by contacting Hilary Wilcox at 314-307-6120

SCHOOLING: The show ring will be open for schooling at 12:00 noon April 4th 2018 however, preparations of the ring (such as the hanging of banners along the outer walls of the facility and the set up of center ring) will be taking place. Trainers and exhibitors are welcome to utilize the show ring for schooling during this set up period. Once the show commences availability will be announced, the ring will close 30 minutes before the start of each session. Show ring is 150' x 300' with composite soil footing. Warm up rings will be available for exhibitor's use. The outdoor warm up ring has stone dust footing and the indoor composite soil footing.

USEF Fees: Drugs/Medications Fee of \$23.00 (\$15 D/M and \$8 fee) applies to all horses excluding opportunity and academy horses. A show pass fee of \$45 applies to anyone not a member of USEF excluding opportunity and academy.

PAYMENTS: A penalty of \$75.00 will be charged for all returned checks. Cash or certified check must replace returned checks. No one will be allowed to show if they have a check or handling fee outstanding. All fees must be paid before numbers will be released or an open check must be on file. Prize Money Will be awarded as below

ENTRIES: Entries close March 25th 2018. Post-entries will be accepted. Entry fees are as follows: Qualifiers are \$25; Championship classes \$40.; Entry Blanks must be completed in full, signed and accompanied by full payment, registration documentation and applicable membership cards. Open checks will be accepted but no numbers will be handed out without an open check in the office. No entry will be processed without the aforementioned being complete. A non-refundable \$25.00 per horse office charge will be assessed. All accounts must be settled in the horse show office by the conclusion of the show. No exceptions.

One number will be issued per entry if lost a fee of \$10 will be charged for replacement.

An additional fee of \$15 per horse will be charged for all accounts not settled in person by the conclusion of the show.

REFUNDS: All scratches must be in writing. Before the closing date: Horses scratched will receive a full refund of all entry and stall fees. After the closing date: all entry fees will be refunded, less a \$25.00 office charge, for any total scratch which is received at least 24 hours prior to its first class. Total scratches received less than 24 hours in advance must be countersigned by the Horse Show Veterinarian to qualify for any refund. Stall fees are not refundable after the closing date of entries.

CHANGES & SCRATCHES: The horse show office will be open 1 hour prior to show time each session. All changes, adds or scratches must be completed prior to the start of the session. Entry fees from timely scratched classes may be credited toward another class entered. No refund will be given.

PRIZE MONEY: All money will be paid through the Horse Show Office. All prize monies in excess of the balance due will be mailed to the owner of record, unless otherwise directed, within 30 days after the completion of the Show. Every exhibitor must furnish his/her social security or Federal I.D. number.

AMATEUR CLASSES: All amateur classes at this show are open to all ages, including those under the age of 18. Amateur cards are no longer available for non-members. Only active Federation members may obtain amateur certification. Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. (Exception: This is not required for Opportunity classes.) (GR1307).

Any Championship (excludes academy & equitation) with 6 or more entries becomes a \$250 Championship.

DOGS/ANIMALS: Dogs and other animals will not be permitted on the premises unless retained on a leash and under control at all times. Unleashed animals will be subject to capture and/or fine and removal from show grounds by Logan Township or the Gloucester County Animal Shelter. A \$50 fine may be imposed on the owner of an unleashed animal. No animals even when leashed and owned by Management personnel are allowed in the office building, pavilion, or vendor area unless owned by the disabled. Keep dogs outside and in the barn areas.

SMOKING: There is no smoking in offices, stable pavilions, spectator pavilion, equine building or indoor arena. As per NJ law this includes electronic cigarettes.

FIRES: In accordance with State regulations, no open fires are ever permitted on any part of DREAM PARK property. Barbecue grills may be used in the camper area only. **THIS RULE IS STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

MINORS WHO DO NOT HAVE A

VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. *The parent(s), legal guardian(s) or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.* Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

DREAM PARK DOES NOT allow roller skates, skate boards or roller blades. Bicycles, mopeds, ATV's, scooters and golf carts may not be operated around the show office, pavilion, vendor area, stall aisles or paddock area except by disabled persons, DREAM PARK employees or show officials. DO NOT staple or post anything on stalls, fence rails or posts, buildings, stall panels, show office, trees etc. All items are to be posted on the notice board near the show office.

STABLE PARKING AREA: Parking around the stable barns and the back side of the main building is strictly prohibited. All vehicles must be parked in the RV area or in the large main parking lot in front of the Dream Park. Be aware that in front of the main doors on the front side of the building there is a restricted parking area and the local police will ticket your car. Make sure you park in an area between the painted lines.

THE UPHA CHAPTER 15, THE CHILDRENS BENEFIT HORSE **SHOW IT'S OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OR OFFICIAL VOLUNTEERS SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE THAT MAY OCCUR TO ANY EXHIBITOR, AGENT, TRAINER, OWNER, MANAGER, RIDER, DRIVER, HANDLER OR SPECTATOR.** IT SHALL BE A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT THE ABOVE NAMED PARTIES SHALL HOLD BLAMELESS THE UPHA CHAPTER 15, THE CHILDRENS BENEFIT HORSE SHOW, ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OR OFFICIAL VOLUNTEERS FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE TO HIS/HER PERSON, EQUIPMENT, *ETAL.* THAT MAY OCCUR FROM SICKNESS, THEFT, FIRE OR OTHER PERIL .

ORDERING FEED & BEDDING:

All feed and bedding must be pre-ordered by March 25th, 2018. By Contacting Hilary Wilcox at 314-307-6120. All orders must be guaranteed by an "open check". Cost of the shavings is \$8.00 per bale; hay and grain will be at market price.

COGGINS TEST/HEALTH CERTIFICATE:

All horses stabled outside of New Jersey must have a current negative Coggins Test dated within one (1) year of the show dates and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated within 30 days of the event. All horses stabled within New Jersey must have a current negative Coggins test dated within two (2) years of the show dates. To speed processing, please send a copy with your entries.

Equine Vaccination Rule :

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recom-

mended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, & control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee

CHANGE OR CANCELLATION:

Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes. Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show.

RING PROCEDURE: Two minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring for the class to commence. At the end of two minutes, the gate will be closed and the class will proceed.

NOISEMAKERS: **USEF Rule** Attention getting devices &/or noisemakers, such as tape measures, blow horns, bamboo poles, explosives and fire extinguishers are not allowed in and around the warm-up and competition rings during the scheduled competition. This includes banging whips, brushes or the like on the show rail during classes. All such items will be confiscated and offenders will be reported to the steward.

SHARPS: Management requires that exhibitors comply with USEF Rule GR 1210 regarding Sharps. Failure to do so will result in a fine.

LIMIT HORSE OR RIDER CLASSES: Either the horse OR rider has not won 6 blue ribbons at a Regular competition of the Federation or Equine Canada in the performance division or level in which they are shown. A horse who has won 6 blue ribbons can be shown by a rider who has not won 6 blue ribbons. A rider who has won 6 blue ribbons can show a horse who has not won 6 blue ribbons. See rule GR 135.

TROPHIES: All Perpetual and Challenge trophies are under the control of Chapter 15 and will remain in the Chapters or the sponsors possession.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED MEMBERSHIP: All Owners and Trainers at USEF recognized competitions rated in the Saddlebred sections must be current members in good standing with the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc. This horse show is rated in Pleasure and in all other divisions. Please put your membership numbers on the entry blank and enclose a copy of your card with your entries.

AMERICAN MORGAN MEMBERSHIP: All owners, riders, drivers, handlers, coaches and trainers at USEF recognized competitions rated in the Morgan sections must be current members in good standing with the American Morgan Horse Association, or pay a fee of \$45 to AMHA. This horse show is rated. Please put your membership numbers on the entry blank and enclose a copy of your card with your entries.

ROAD HORSE/PONY REQUIREMENTS

Roadster Horses: In order to compete all horses must be a Standardbred or Standardbred type. Roadster Ponies are not permitted to compete in Roadster Horse classes. a. All horses competing in Federation licensed competitions must be properly identified and must obtain a Roadster Horse Identification number from the American Road Horse and Pony Association (ARHPA). An ARHPA

Roadster Horse ID number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions. b. Only one unique ARHPA Roadster Horse ID Number will be issued per horse. This unique ID number must subsequently remain with the horse throughout its career. Any one knowingly applying for a duplicate ID Number for an individual horse may be subject to disciplinary action. c. The Federation and/or ARHPA as applicable must be notified of any change of ownership and/or competition name of the horse. Owners are requested to notify the Federation and/or ARHPA as applicable of corrections to previously submitted information, e.g., names, addresses, breed registration, pedigree, or markings. d. The ARHPA Roadster Horse ID application is available from the ARHPA or Federation office, or it can be downloaded from the ARHPA or Federation website or completed in the competition office. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement in their prize list. BOD 1/16/16 Effective 12/1/16.2. Roadster Ponies: Registration is not required for ponies competing in the Roadster division. Ponies may not be shown in a performance class unless the owner possesses a current Measurement Card or valid Measurement Form issued by the Federation (see GR502). All Roadster Ponies must be re-measured and issued new measurement cards prior to competing in licensed competitions for the year 2004 and beyond. 3. Membership Requirements. e. Owners and trainers of roadster ponies participating at Federation licensed competitions in the Roadster Division must be current members in good standing with either the American Road Horse and Pony Association or the American Hackney Horse Society. f. Owners, riders, drivers, and trainers of horses participating at Federation licensed competitions in the Roadster Division must be current members in good standing with the American Road Horse and Pony Association. g. Originals or copies of the above listed membership cards must be provided to the competition unless at its discretion the membership can be confirmed electronically with either the AHHS or the ARHPA office. h. Lessees are considered owners in connection with these membership requirements. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a member of the required organization. **CAMPERS:** Limited camper spaces are available at a cost of \$50.00 per day. Space includes water and one 50 Amp hookup. Please show number of days and costs on your Entry Blank. Tents or camping in tents is not permitted on DREAM PARK grounds. 2018 will require camper pass from office confirming the number of nights, failure to get one will mean you will be charged for 5 nights.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENTLife, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Re-

quirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Governed by USEF Chapter SB. In order to compete, all horses must be registered with the American Saddlebred Registry or the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation. They must be entered in their full registered names with registration numbers and under the names of the owner(s) of record with the AS.R. or the CL.R.C. 2. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership, or a copy of the registration papers with a Certificate of Eligibility to Show issued by the American Saddlebred Registry must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry or presented to competition office before competition number will be released **unless the competition, at their discretion, confirms registration electronically with the American Saddlebred Registry or the Canadian Livestock**

Records Corporation; competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement. See GR1308.2a(5). Exception: Horses shown in any USEF Regular Competition prior to December 31, 1979, and American Saddlebred-type ponies. The ASR will provide the Federation with a monthly report of affidavits filed in violation of this Article. A copy of the registration papers will be returned when exhibitors pick up their numbers, if requested. In the event a person files a false affidavit or an affidavit to show change of ownership or change of name without having submitted all required paperwork and fees to the American Saddlebred Registry, the Federation will levy a fine against that person in the amount of \$200. See GR1302.2a(5), GR907.4, and GR1308.2a(5). If the foregoing \$200 **fine is not paid within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine,** said person and any horses owned by him/her or his/her stable will be **automatically suspended until the fine is paid. If the person disputes that the fine is not properly owing, he/she can request a hearing of these issues**

before the Hearing Committee, provided a written statement specifying the grounds for the hearing is received at the Federation's office within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine. The request must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 made by a Federation member or the parent of a junior exhibitor member or \$200 if made by a non-member (check payable to the Federation). Said deposit will be refunded in the event the hearing is resolved in the favor of the member/non-member. 3. Owners and trainers of horses participating at Federation licensed competitions in all American Saddlebred sections must be current competing members in good standing with the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc. or the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada and provide an original or copy of the ASHA or ASHA of Canada membership card unless the competition, at their discretion, confirms membership electronically with the ASHA or the ASHA of Canada office. Les-sees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a member. Exception: Owners and trainers of horses competing in American Saddlebred restricted walk/trot classes are exempt from ASHA and ASHA of Canada membership. If the ASHA competing membership card is not available, the exhibitor, or his or her agent, must sign the ASHA membership affidavit giving his or her name, address, the fact that he or she is in possession of the proper credentials and the reason the information is not available. In the event a person files a false affidavit to prove membership with the ASHA, the Federation will levy a fine against that person in the amount of \$200. See GR1302.2a(5), GR1302.2c, GR907.4, and GR1308.2b. If the foregoing \$200

fine is not paid within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine, said person and any horses owned by him/her or his/her stable will be automatically suspended until the fine is paid. If the person disputes that the fine is not properly owing, he/she can request a review of these issues before the Hearing Committee, provided a written statement specifying the grounds for the review is received at the Federation's office within 30 days of receipt of the Federation's notice of fine. The request must be accompanied by a deposit of \$200 made by a Federation member or the parent of a junior exhibitor member or \$200 if made by a non-member (check payable to the Federation). Said deposit will be refunded in the event the review is resolved in favor of the member/non-member.

Riders are to show horses that are used in a lesson program and must be participating in a professionally operated lesson program. Any breed is eligible. General: Safety is of utmost importance, any unruly, out of control or disruptive horse will be excused. The judge may stop the class until the entry has been assisted. No action devices of any kind are allowed on academy horse in the show ring, warm up or grounds. No attention getting devices of any kind are allowed near academy horses in the show ring or warm up. Headers are permitted in line up in any class. Age of rider is determined by the age as of December 1 of the previous year. Horses used in Academy may be shown in classes other than Academy at the same show.

Attire: English – jodhpurs, breeches, boots, long sleeved shirt with a vest and tie, gloves, whips are optional. Please note that derbies, riding suits and jackets are prohibited. Western – western style pants, long sleeved shirt with or without vest, boots and appropriate tie, gloves. Please note that chaps and western hats are prohibited. No barn logos anywhere on show attire. Tack: May show in show bridle, Pelham, or snaffle bridle with martingale. Half cup blinkers are allowed, full cup blinkers or blinders are prohibited. Saddle pads are optional, no logos or names except Exceptional Challenge Cup. All riders under the age of 18 in Academy classes **must** wear protective headgear. Protective headgear is recommended for all riders.

Level 1 Academy Showmanship – Restricted to riders that have special needs and are currently riding in a standard lesson program. A ground person will be allowed in

the ring for safety purposes only, **no coaching will be permitted from inside the ring**. The Championship classes will not have a pattern. Entries in these classes may not cross enter into any other classes at this show, except for the UPHA Exceptional Challenge Cup Classes.

The Academy Walk/Trot classes for Hunt Seat or Western riders are open to hunt seat or western riders of all ages.

First Year: Only riders who have not shown at any show, rated or unrated, or tournaments prior to December 1, 2017 are eligible.

Academy Driving: Only drivers who have not shown in a regular driving class at any show, rated or unrated are eligible. Two wheel carts only and the harness must have a martingale and either a side check or an overcheck. They must have an adult passenger with driving experience

Lead Line: Riders are to be led by an adult both ways of the ring. A lead must be attached and held by handler at all times. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged on the riders basic equitation, skills and ability. Entries will be asked to trot individually if they wish.

Showmanship: Academy showmanship classes are to be judged on presentation, ringmanship, basic position and ability to control their horse. The horse's quality is not to be judged. There will not be patterns in showmanship Championships.

Equitation: Academy Equitation riders are to be judged on basic equitation skills, position and ability to control their horse. 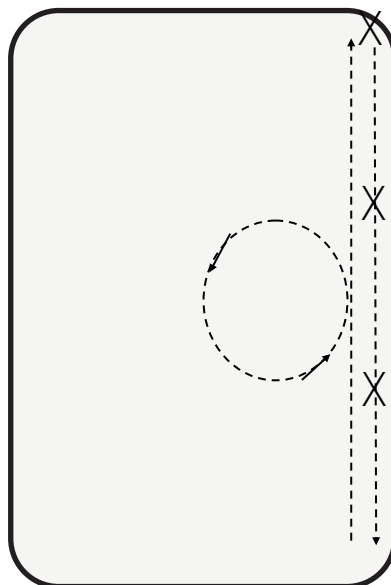

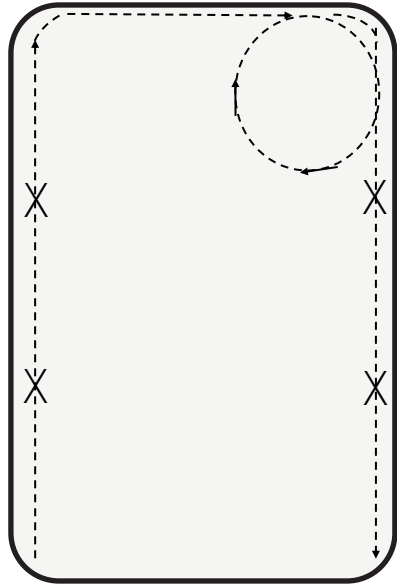

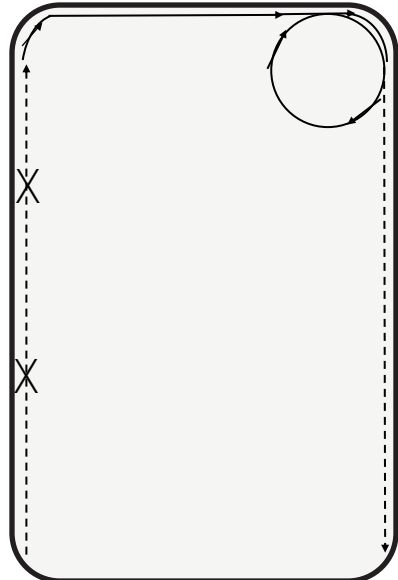
